#### **COVID-19 PHASE 2B**

At the March Board meeting, the Sandalwood Board of Directors voted to open up all outdoor amenities. Promising signs are occurring, the numbers of positive cases and deaths in Florida are leveling as more people become vaccinated. On the downside, Florida leads the country in the number of positives for the highly contagious UK variant of Covid-19. We still are not allowing any guests to use any of the amenities. #### **OUTDOOR AMENITIES**

All outdoor amenities are open and can be used by park guests. This includes the pool, patio, bocce and shuffle board courts as well as the putting green.

ANY AMENITIES INSIDE THE CLUBHOUSE REMAIN RESTRICTED TO SHAREHOLDERS, TENENTS AND RENTERS ONLY. GUESTS ARE STILL RESTRICTED FROM USING ANYTHING IN THE CLUBHOUSE.

#### No Guests

- · You must log in at door giving date, time, unit number and printed name
- Maintain Social Distancing
- Wipe down the equipment you are going to use with available spray disinfectant before you use them

#### ACTIVITIES ROOM

#### <u>No Guests</u>

- Mask must be worn
- · Open for exercise class only during the day
- Maintain Social Distancing
- A maximum of 6 residents using the room at any time
- · Must wipe down any surfaces you come in contact with
- · No cards, bingo, or games

#### **LIBRARY**

- <u>No Guests</u>
- Mask must be worn.
- · Library is open to get and return books and puzzles
- · Please wipe down and books or puzzles you are returning
- · Please gain access to the library through the front clubhouse door by the office

#### LAUNDRY

#### <u>Remains open</u>

Mask must be worn

• Please wipe down any surfaces you come in contact before you use them: washer lids, dryer handles, folding table surfaces, etc.

#### SMALL RESTROOM BY LAUNDRY

This is the only restroom that is open in the clubhouse.

I have many memories from my early childhood of talking into my Grandpa's pocket, so his body-aid would pick up my voice. Both my grandfather, Howard and my Mom, MaryEllen, were profoundly hard of hearing.

My Mom's hearing was due to surgical procedure. She had been wearing hearing aids for years before I came into the industry 14 years ago.
