

Tai Chi Classes Start on Tuesday, December 2nd


Join us each Tuesday and Thursday at 10:00 am in the clubhouse. Tai chi is an ancient Chinese martial arts tradition that is practiced today as a form of exercise. It involves a series of movements performed in a slow, focused manner and accompanied by deep breathing. Tai Chi, also called Tai Chi Chuan, is a low impact, self-paced system of gentle physical exercise and stretching emphasizing joint mobility. Each posture flows into the next without pause, ensuring that your body is in constant motion.

Benefits include:

- Decreased stress and anxiety
- · Increased aerobic capacity
- · Increased energy and stamina
- Increased flexibility, balance and agility
- Increased muscle strength and definition

There is also some evidence that Tai Chi also may help:

- Enhance quality of sleep
- Enhance the immune system
- Lower cholesterol levels and blood pressure
- Improve joint pain
- Improve symptoms of congestive heart failure
- Improve overall well-being in older adults
- Reduce risk of falls in older adults

Thanks to Mike Smith, we have 2 bocce courts just waiting for us to jump start. The courts were just recently completed.


Lessons will be offered on Jan. 5, and by January 15, competition within our park will take place. Mike plans to put us all in teams, and will contact each of us shortly.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH Apple Fritters with orange sauce

- 1 cup flour
- 1 teas. baking powder
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- ¼ teas. salt
- ¼ cup milk
- 1 egg
- 2 cups chopped apples

Combine 1st four ingredients. Stir with fork. Add egg to milk and beat well. Then add to flour. Batter will be thick. Add apples and stir well. Drop in hot fat and fry. Serve with orange sauce.

- ½ cup sugar
- 2 Tbsp. flour
- 1 cup water or OJ
- Dash salt
- 1 tsp. butter
- Dash red food coloring

(If not using OJ, add 2-3 Tbsp. orange juice concentrate)




