### Life in Lee's Eyes.....

Some people still yearn for the good old days. If their minds are so far gone that they can't remember what the good old days were really like then, let them yearn. They must not remember the blistering hot days without air conditioning or the cold winter night trips to the outhouse or the Saturday night baths in the kitchen sink.

A friend recently emailed some interesting facts from the year 1909, just a hundred years ago. Only 14% of families had a bathtub. Life expectancy was 47 years....sugar was 4 cents a pound....the average wage was 22

cents per hour....20% of the population couldn't read or write....women washed their hair once a month, using Borax or egg yolks for shampoo and there were only 230 murders in the entire USA. There aren't too many people who would remember any of this, but how long will it be before life expectancy will be well over 100 years?

Personally, I liked the good old kid days...like stealing watermelon days. Usually teenagers met in the school yard and compared notes about which farmer had the largest watermelon path hidden in a cornfield. Ringleaders then devised a safe strategy. Where should we park the cars? Who's driving? Keep your head down. Keep quiet!! No one ever knew for sure if a farmer's shotgun held pellets or real bullets. It didn't matter. When the shots were fired, hopefully overhead, it was time to grab a melon and run. Back at the school yard sometimes upper classmen would inject vodka into the watery feast with a bovine syringe. That was a good night to sneak home and get in bed undetected.

Halloween was always a favorite time. Back in the 40's, many families still had outhouses with Montgomery Ward catalogs for reading material. Halloween night was not a good night to order merchandise. Most outhouses in small towns were tipped over, occupied or not. Professional tricksters outdid themselves by transporting several such structures to the school grounds and blocking the building entrance. Even the teachers seemed to enjoy that gimmick. Older people with kid instincts, probably parents, got their kicks by dismantling a piece of farm equipment, hoisting it to the top of a building and then reassembling it. Trick or treating in those days involved the entire family and dividing the loot, after scaring the natives, became a true lesson in sharing.

Who remembers May Basket Day? Pre-teenagers put candy in a homemade basket, placed it on the doorstep of a member of the opposite sex, knocked on the door and ran. The recipient's job was to chase the donor and when caught, give him or her a kiss. That's how the term "taking a fall" got started. It took a while in those days to master the art of falling down early during the chase.

Now that some of us have reached the age of significant chronological maturity, another life event requires attention. How and where and when do we celebrate Christmas? The usual family gatherings have taken a hit now that kids, grandkids and great grandkids are geographically scattered. And since they are all growing up, shopping for everyone is a challenge.

We celebrated Christmas in Omaha this year on November 8<sup>th</sup>. If the true meaning of Christmas is remembered, the calendar date probably doesn't matter. What mattered this year were the blizzard conditions in Colorado. When Denver freezes, our area is on schedule for the same. Getting to Florida becomes a high priority. I met a person one time who had never seen snow...never slid down a hill on a sled...never had a snowball fight....never built a snow fort or got stuck in a snowdrift. How unfortunate. He probably ran off to Florida with no good reason.

It's great to enjoy the benefits of Sandalwood in the winter months. The new clubhouse, thanks to some farsighted leaders, will be a haven for Christmas activities. We will miss the family on December 25<sup>th</sup>, but they will experience the joy of starting another tradition with our grandchildren and great grandchildren, and thanks to ma bell we will share some of it with them. 
If you would like to send additional needs for the mothers, here are a few of the suggested items that you could put under the tree:

### Strawberry Supreme Salad

3/4 cup sugar
8 oz. cream cheese
1 (20 oz.) can crushed pineapple, drained
1 (10 oz.) pkg. frozen strawberries, thawed
2 bananas chopped
1 (16 oz.) pkg. whipped topping
3/4 cup chopped nuts (optional)

Cream the sugar and cream cheese in a large mixing bowl. Fold in the pineapple, strawberries, bananas, whipped topping and nuts. Spoon the mixture into a freezer-proof serving dish. Freeze, covered, until firm. Let stand for 45 minutes to thaw before serving. Yield 20 servings.

### Fruit salad with Lime Zest

2 Granny Smith apples, chopped
1 cup seedless red grape halves
1 (11 oz.) can mandarin oranges, drained
1 1/2 cups miniature marshmallows
3/4 cup French vanilla yogurt
Grated zest of 1 lime
2 Tbs. chopped pecans

Combine the apples, grapes, oranges, marshmallows, yogurt and lime zest in a bowl. Add the oranges and toss to combine. Sprinkle the pecans over the top. Yield: 4-6 servings

### MINUTES OF THE BUDGET WORKSHOP BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

### September 1, 2015

A special board meeting was scheduled for 10:00 A.M. on September 1, 2015, in the Sandpiper Room.

The meeting was called to order at 10:02 A.M. by the Manager, Ms. Korte.

Notice of the meeting was posted on the property prior to the meeting in accordance with the requirements of the Association Documents and Florida Statutes.

The following Directors were in attendance:

Regina Fortin Larry Reed Joe Nofziger Bob Jenne\* Mitch Watson\* Al Burns\* Norm Vandenbusche\* Ken Lauzon\*

A Quorum was determined to be present. (\*) indicates attendance via speaker phone.

**UNDER THE HEADING OF MATTERS RELATING TO THE 2016 BUDGET AND RESERVE SCHEDULE,** 2 budget options, one with funding reserves and one with waiving reserves, were presented to the Board for review. Each option was discussed in detail. After further discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Lauzon and seconded by Mr. Vandenbusche, and it was **VOTED:** to forego a membership vote on waiving the reserves, to allocate \$388,890 of current surplus funds into the 2016 reserve line items and to fund reserves for the 2016 fiscal year.

Regina Fortin, Larry Reed, Joe Nofziger, Bob Jenne, Al Burns, Norm Vandenbusche and Ken Lauzon were in favor. Mitch Watson was opposed. Motion passed.

The proposed budget (see attachment #1), with funding reserves, will be mailed to all Shareholders with notice of the meeting at which the budget will be adopted.

With no further business to come before the Board, upon a motion made and seconded, the meeting

adjourned at 10:33 A.M.
