Several people stayed for the movie, *RED*, thanks to Gil and Marci Weidemiller for providing the military showing.



Cajun Barbeque: Peel and Eat Shrimp

By Mango Dragonfly

- ½ cup butter
- ¾ cup hickory flavored BBQ sauce
- 2 Tbs. lemon juice
- 1 ½ tsp cayenne pepper
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 lbs. large shrimp, shell on

Preheat broiler. Melt butter in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add the barbeque sauce, lemon juice, cayenne pepper and garlic and stir until well blended. Spread the shrimp out on a large cookie sheet. Pour the butter mixture over the shrimp and toss to coat. Broil the shrimp for 3 minutes. Turn them over and broil for 3 minutes more. Remove from the oven and let them sit and soak in the juice for 5 minutes; then serve.




