

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Golf Cart Regulations

The board has decided to feature a Sandalwood Regulation in the monthly newsletter. The Dog leash rule has been featured in the last couple. This month's feature is the golf cart regulations, (see below). 7.8

- Golf carts are permitted within the park, but must be registered at the park office and operated safely under the following guidelines:
- Golf Cart Registration Form must be completed and signed by all applicants.
- Golf Carts must be properly registered and a <u>current</u> proof of insurance on file with Management before it can be operated in the park.
- The Golf Cart "owners" will place 4 inch reflective numbers of the "owners" Unit Number on each side of the golf cart at time of registration and before the golf cart can be operated in the park. These numbers must be displayed while the golf cart is in operation in the park.
- No golf cart can be operated within the park by anyone younger than 16 years of age.
 - Only one golf cart is allowed per home.
- Golf Carts must be parked on driveways, never on the grass.
- Golf Carts must follow all the rules and regulations of motorized vehicles.
- Golf Carts must be equipped with headlights and red taillights if operated before sunrise and after sunset.


