Venice Train Depot



The Seaboard Air Line (SAL) was the first railroad to expand its network into Sarasota County, Florida, extending tracks first to Sarasota in 1903 and Fruitville in 1905. The SAL extended their network into Venice in 1911, at the instigation of Mrs. Potter Palmer, whose family had just purchased thousands of acres adjacent to the Venice area. The first depot in Venice was located originally at the junction of what is now Tampa and Nokomis Avenues.

For a town as small as Venice was, the train station was huge, boasting a 400-foot-long platform, baggage and freight rooms, a prominent tower and extensive arcades spanning the length of the platform. The total cost of the depot was \$47,500. It opened for service in March, 1927.

The Venice Seaboard Air Line Depot became an important point of transit for the city over the next forty-five years. It was served by great SCL trains such as the *Camellia* and the *Orange Blossom Special*. The station regularly welcomed students and faculty from the Kentucky Military Institute. Once the Army established an air base in Venice in 1942, it became the primary point of entry to the city for U.S. Army material and personnel. In the sixties, 1960s, the Ringling Bros. and Barnum and Bailey Circus used it for shipping their equipment and operations around the country.

Passenger service to the station finally ceased in April 1971 with the consolidation of nearly all the nation's passenger trains into the new National Railroad Passenger Corporation also known as Amtrak.

Grilling Sweet Corn

Strip the corn husk all the way back, but leave it still attached to the base.

Remove all the silk...there is a piece of silk for every kernel, so be diligent.

You may see that something has nibbled a little bit before you got there...take it as a sign of good, tasty, organically grown corn and move past this.

Replace the husks and soak the corn in a tub of cold water for 15 minutes.

Prepare the grill to medium high.

Place corn on the grill rack and cook for about 15 minutes...turning frequently.

When done remove the husks...careful of embers and serve with butter and lots of pepper.

Lemon Herb Butter

- 1 stick butter, softened
- 1 tsp black pepper, coarsely ground
- 2 tsp thyme
- 2 tsp sage
- 2 tsp lemon zest

Stir ingredients together until well blended. Refrigerate until ready to serve

Chili Lime Butter

stick butter, softened
 garlic clove, minced
 1/4 cup lime juice
 tbsp paprika
 tsp red pepper flakes
 tsp cumin

Stir ingredients together until well blended. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

Ginger Wasabi Butter

- 1 stick butter, softened
- 2 tsp ginger, peeled and finely grated
- 1 tsp wasabi powder
- 1 tsp soy sauce

Stir ingredients together until well blended. Refrigerate until ready to serve.

Garlic Parmesan Butter

- 1 stick butter, softened
- 2 cloves garlic, minced

1/4 cup parmesan cheese, grated

Stir ingredients together until well blended. Refrigerate until ready to serve

Colorful Park Residents

To say that some of our park residents are colorful would be an understatement! Florida is a birder's paradise. Thanks to what was the most aggressive public land acquisition program in the world, one-quarter of the state is protected as public conservation or privately protected land. Four major stops on the Great Florida Birding trail are right in our backyard; Jelks Preserve, Venice Audubon Rookery, Shamrock Park and Nature Center and Casperen Beach.

In a pattern very similar to their two-legged neighbors the 515 species on the Official Florida Bird List breaks down as follows:



- Permanent residents: 142 \Diamond
- Spring/summer residents: 29 \Diamond
- Solely Migrants: 49 \Diamond
- Winter residents: 137 \Diamond
- Very rare or Casual: 132 \Diamond
- Non-breeding sea birds: 22 \Diamond
- Extinct: 4
