Here is some information on recent doings in Sandalwood Park. The Queen palms have been moved to an evenly spaced row in the hedge along Cortina road. We have received many compliments on how much better the road looks from both Sandalwood and Venice Isles. The plants that were removed to make room for the Palms are sprucing up the back gate and pool area. We will continue to flood the new plantings for the month of February.


Speaking of Cortina road, the folks at Venice Isle are making a real effort to observe the stop signs, now that we got their attention. Also I see more people walking their dogs on the west side of the road now. The management at VI is really trying to help relieve our people's concerns on these subjects.

Many thanks to Al Brown, Larry Fortin, Larry Reed, and Norm Vandenbusche for their help in getting the Irrigation system installed at the back gate in time for the new plants.

In our February Board meeting we received several letters with concerns and suggestions for park improvements. As a result of those letters we appointed three Ad-Hoc committees:

- To suggest wording for a change to the rules that will insure more spacing between homes.
- To look at the feasibility of informing members of meetings via E-Mail.
- To set up specs and obtain quotes for construction of Bocce ball courts

Another letter expressed the need for better handicapped access to the pool and patio area. I presented a graphic showing how we could extend the sidewalk in front of the handicapped spaces to meet the rear clubhouse sidewalk and compress a few parking spots to put a direct walkway from the road to the rear sidewalk. The Board voted to obtain quotes for this project.

A petition was delivered to the Board expressing concern about the increasing number of home purchases strictly for rental. I explained that we have the tools to control that, and only need the Board to be aware and employ them.


In January we appointed a committee to obtain samples and pricing for furniture for the patio. They presented their recommendations and showed some samples to the audience. The Board decided to go ahead with the purchase of 8 tables and 44 chairs for the patio. In a related action, the Board decided to make approximately half of the blue folding chairs available to the residents for \$5 each. Also we voted to replace the old pink chairs with 30 new black ones, because some are getting quite worn and there are not enough pink ones for the Huff n Puff program,.

The questionnaires that were sent out with the annual meeting mailing demonstrated that the majority were in favor of changing the pet rules limiting dogs to one per household. We will be looking at how to word that change. Owners with two will be grandfathered.

Lastly we voted to change the annual meeting to the third Thursday in January as stated in our bylaws. This will more closely align with our fiscal year, and allow new board members one more month to become acclimated to their new positions.

COOKS CORNER



Recipes for March Cooking

Grilled Sweet and Sour Drumsticks

- ¹/₄ cup tomato paste
- 2/3 cup soy sauce
- 1 tsp Chinese 5 spice powder
- ¹/₂ cup apple cider vinegar
- ¹/₂ cup orange marmalade
- ½ cup honey
- ¹/₂ cup minced onion
- 3 Serrano chilies, diced
- 4 garlic cloves, minced
- 12 chicken drumsticks (if standing) or 8 chicken thighs (if sitting)

Mix everything but the chicken together in a medium bowl until well blended. Prepare for medium, indirect-heat grilling. Place the chicken on the grill in a flame free zone and baste with the sauce. Continue to cook, turning and basting frequently until the chicken registers 165* in about 20 minutes.

New England Clam Chowder By Pat Griffith


- 4 cans Chopped clams with juice
- 3 bottles clam juice
- ✤ ½ chopped onion
- 1-2 potatoes diced
- 1 TBS. butter
- 1 pint or a little more whole milk or ¹/₂ and ¹/₂ or evaporated milk

Pour clam juice into pot; add onion and diced potato. Cook about 10 minutes. Add canned clams with their juice. Simmer about 5 minutes. Add the TBS. of butter, and let sit 5-10 minutes. Then add the milk, and let it sit for an hour or even overnight in the refrigerator. Should make enough for 4-6 bowl size servings.

Routine Maintenance in Sandalwood Community Center Needs Everyone's Cooperation

Clean-up and Follow-up is key! After each function in the Sandpiper Room, there is now a list of clean-up responsibilities that needs to be followed, such as sweeping the floor, taking off the fans and lights, and emptying the dish washer (next day) if used. All doors need to be locked. The list is now posted in the kitchen for all to read, so that SAC members do not need to clean up spills the following day. Please follow these necessary procedures, so that our club house remains clean for the next function. Here is an advanced copy of them:

Closing the Club House Routine

Kitchen

- Clean all dishes, including pots and pans.
- Empty the dishwasher the next day, if used.
- Wipe all surfaces, including tables that had tablecloths on them.
- Sweep the kitchen floor.
- Take all trash to the dumpster. Place clean trash bags in baskets.
- Take dirty wash rags home to clean and return.
- Shut the ice maker door.

Sandpiper Room

- Clean up any spills of liquid or food.
- Turn off the sound system. Put mikes away, and recharge any dead batteries.
- Put all chairs and tables back into the BINGO setup.
- Turn off bathroom lights.
- Turn off all fans and lights, before leaving.
- Turn off outside lights, including the portico.

Hallway

- Lock outer doors, and close indoor doors as a fire precaution.
- Turn off lights.

Laundry

• Check that all lights have been turned off.

Activities Room

• Check that thermostat is set to cool and to 85 degrees.

Outside

• Check that ALL doors are locked.
