Final Concert of the Series-William Florian

William Florian will be our last concert of the series and will be performing at 7:00 Sunday, March 12. His show, "Those Were the Days", is an upbeat musical journey of America's greatest folk and pop songs of the 60's, including hit songs he performed with The New Christy Minstrels. William is known as the 'American Musical Ambassador of Peace'. His love of music of the 60's shines through as he mesmerizes audiences with his amusing and heart warming show. He will be performing songs he sang as a lead singer for the famous New Christy Minstrels, plus songs of Peter Paul and Mary, John Denver, The Mamas and the Papas, and others, as well as some uplifting originals. Florian reminds us that 'peace and love' and great songs with inspiring lyric content are as important now to the masses as they were in the 60's.

SANDALWOOD CONCERT SERIES: HOW IT ALL COMES ABOUT

In an effort to promote the yearly concert series, SAC Board members, and other residents who work with SAC, feel it is important for residents to understand the process and hard work that goes into selection and planning of the three concerts held in the park. Each December Entertainment Showcases are held across the state at various mobile home parks. The last seven years Sandalwood residents have attended showcases held at Venice Isles and other locations in western Florida. Twenty-three acts performed on December 2nd this year. Each act is permitted 12 minutes to perform for an audience of mobile home residents from surrounding counties. The acts who perform in a showcase have been pre-selected by the Entertainment Agency with whom SAC works.

At the conclusion of a showcase, the Sandalwood committee members individually rate each act and meet to discuss and determine which three acts should be included in our concert series. Selections are made a year in advance of the series. SAC President Carmen Wallin must contact the director of the agency to negotiate dates and possibly the cost for each act chosen.

Ticket prices are determined by the cost of performances. Currently one ticket for a series of three concerts costs \$60.00, which is very reasonable for these professional performances.

Individual tickets will be available at the door for \$25.00. Each year SAC tries to sell enough tickets to cover the cost of all performers. Monies to support all of the SAC activities must be raised by the Annual Rummage/bake/ hot dog sale, the annual picnic, 50/50 tickets and money received from SPH Board.

When choosing the acts for concerts, the committee of six must take several factors into consideration: cost; availability of act on selected date; suitability for Sandalwood Park residents; equipment needs; and the variety of music or material. The SAC Board encourages all residents to support and attend the excellent concert series planned each year. They also encourage input from other residents and extend an invitation to all to become involved in the work of SAC to help make Sandalwood Park an inviting and fun place to live.

Florida Sea Turtles

5 species of Sea Turtles inhabit Florida's waters though only 3 species nest on Florida's beaches. Florida is one of the largest nesting area in the world for Sea Turtles. Nesting season is from March 1 thru October 31st. When visiting Florida beaches during this time it is not unlikely that you will see areas marked or roped off where a sea turtle nest is (as they are protected by the Florida State Statutes, Chapter 370.12). And most beaches where they nest have a "lights out" policy after a specified time to prevent the sea turtles from going toward the lights.

Sea turtles can lay several nests in one season, in each nest laying approximately 100 eggs. The female covers the eggs with sand and then leaves the eggs to incubate for 2 months. The temperature of the nest actually determines the sex of the turtles. When the eggs hatch, the hatchlings race toward the water. A

very small percentage of the hatchlings ever survive and live to adulthood. The females who do always return to nest on the same beach where they hatched.
