Sandalwood Rules Reviewed:

SPEED LIMIT: 15 MPH..... This means EVERYONE

Parking on the grass

Vehicles may park parallel to a street with two wheels on the grass, but "never overnight". Vehicles must be parked in the carport or on the driveway of the residence. Vehicles must not obstruct the free passage of emergency vehicles along any roadway.

Repairing of vehicles, boats, motors, etc. is prohibited.

Overnight parking on the roadway is prohibited.

Parking in a neighbors' driveway or carport is prohibited. Persons parking in neighbors' driveway or carport assume all responsibility for any damage or oil stains caused by their vehicle. Written permission shall be obtained prior to use of a neighbors' driveway or carport during their absence.

No recreational vehicles are allowed in the Park, residents' driveways, lot or on the roadway except to load or unload (never overnight)

No vehicle shall be allowed in the Park without a current registration.

Motor powered bikes or scooters having 50cc or less engine displacement may be approved by making application and passing a sound level meter test by management. Sandalwood residents must obtain written approval for management to ride a specific vehicle "the most direct route from the entrance to their home". Approval does not allow guest or other residents to ride motorbikes in the park. Visitors must also follow the rules and regulations of Sandalwood. Please educate your guest.





This Month's Recipe by Helena Schwalm

One Bowl Chocolate Cake

2 cups all-purpose flour ½ tsp. salt

2 cups sugar 2 eggs, lightly beaten

½ cup baking cocoa 1 cup canola oil

2 tsp. baking soda 1 cup buttermilk

1 tsp baking powder 1 cup hot water

Preheat oven to 350. Grease a 13x9in baking pan. In a bowl, whisk the first six ingredients. Stir in eggs, oil and buttermilk. Add water, stir.

Transfer batter to prepared pan. Bake 35-40 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool in pan on a wire rack. Frost cake. Add sprinkles if desired.

Chocolate Buttercream Frosting

In a bowl, beat ½ cup softened butter until creamy. Beat in 2 cups confectioners sugar, 1/4 cup baking cocoa, ½ tsp. vanilla and 3-4 Tbs. 2% milk to achieve desired consistency.

Motion was made by Bob Jenne to adjourn the meeting, **2**nd **by** Joe Nofziger. **Motion passed** The meeting was adjourned,




