

Concert Series



Don't forget the concert series tickets and selecting seats will be at 10:00, Friday, December 2 in the activity room. If you

are not able to be there to get your tickets, you may have a friend buy your tickets for you, or you may send your check ahead of time and call at 10:00 on that morning. On that day you may call 712-330-9521 to select your seats. We must have your money before you select your seats, so allow plenty of time if you mail a check.

The tickets are only \$60.00 per person for the whole season. You won't have a seating chart to look at but maybe knowing how the seats are arranged may help. We have 8 rows with 6 seats on the left (by the patio) and 8 seats on the right (by the front door). The seats are numbered with seat number 1 being on the aisle.

We have three wonderful shows. The first is "Wallstreet", a variety band show on Sunday, January 15th at 7:00; the second is the "Katy Brooks Show, which is a variety vocal show on Sunday, February 19 at 7:00; the third is William Florian with "Those Were the Days Show" with music of the 60's.


The Dumpster



Comcast pays \$2.3M to end probe

NEW YORK - **Comcast** is paying \$2.3 million after regulators said the cable giant has charged millions of customers for things they never ordered, such as premium channels or extra cable boxes.
