


## Sandalwood Park News



### COOKS CORNER



#### QUICK AND EASY LAST MINUTE MEAL

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- Peel, core and slice 4 small apples.
- Place apples in bowl and sprinkle with 1 tbls flour, 1 tsp cinnamon, <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> tsp nutmeg.
- Prepare 1 6-ounce package stuffing mix as directed and spread in bottom of 9/13 pan.
- Place 4 boneless pork chops on top of stuffing and cover each with apple mixture.
- Cover Pan with aluminum foil and bake for 1 hour.

#### THREE NEW IDEAS FOR BACON

1. Cook 8 slices bacon. Chop 6 slices; add to 24 ounce jar Vodka sauce in saucepan and simmer. Toss with 1 lb cooked penne; top with <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup grated Parmesan and remaining slices bacon, chopped.

2. Blend 6 chopped hard-cooked eggs, 2 ribs chopped celery, 1/3 cup light mayo, ½ tsp Dijon mustard and 3 slices chopped cooked bacon. Season with salt and pepper. Serve with crackers.

3. Place 1 lb thick-sliced bacon in single layer on large broiler pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 minutes. Blend 3 tbls dark brown sugar and 1 ½ tsp hot chili powder. Turn bacon and top with sugar mixture. Bake 25 minutes more, until crisp. Serve for breakfast or with salads.

#### SANDALWOOD PARK HOMEOWNERS CLUBHOUSE RULES

- 1. No notices, other than emergency or official, are to be attached to any walls, doors, windows, etc. inside or outside of the building. Bulletin boards are provided for sharing information. Push pins or cellophane tape are not to be used for any purpose on walls and doors.
- 2. Decorations for holidays or events must avoid damage to walls or ceilings.
- 3. Any group using the facilities is expected to pick up trash and do basic cleaning of equipment and furnishings. Park maintenance personnel will dust and mop floors as needed.
- 4. Event leaders (or last to leave the building) are to turn off heat or air, turn off interior lights, audio/visual equipment, appliances, etc. and lock all doors.
- 5. NO PARKING in the portico outside Sandpiper Room. This facility is for dropping off and picking up only. Do not block the drive to the portico. Short term parking is allowed in front of the laundry and office while conducting business but must not block the drive. Primary parking for Sandpiper Room is in the marked grass areas to the south. Overflow parking is allowed across Sandpiper in the grass. Bicycles should park in the grass in front of the Portico.
- 6. Official room designations are "Sandpiper Room", "Activities Room", "Exercise Room", "Library", "Office", "File Room", "Laundry", and "Information Hall".
